Purpose:

- Identify risk factors for inappropriate medication use in older adults.

Module II: Geriatric Assessment and Communication With Older Adults

- Discuss the importance of a pharmacist conducted patient interview and review of systems.
- Identify appropriate assessment instruments to use for a given set of symptoms or patient complaints.

Module III: Developing Medication Therapy Management Services for Older Adults

- Discuss how to get MTM services started in a community setting.

A One-Day Continuing Education Workshop for Pharmacists



Purpose:

This one-day application-based workshop will provide pharmacists with additional training in medication therapy management for older adults as well as offer training in providing quality educational experiences in geriatrics for pharmacy students in the practice setting. Using case studies, participants will work in teams to identify drug-related problems and formulate rational interventions. Participants will be able to describe the rationale for the correct therapeutic decisions made in the case studies.

Objectives:

- Identify appropriate assessment instruments to use for a given set of symptoms or patient complaints.
- Gain experience in administering and interpreting a variety of assessment instruments.
- Describe the purpose, objectives and competencies expected in the geriatric APPEs in the pharmacy school curriculum.
- Identify opportunities in your practice setting for students to gain experience caring for older adults.
- Discuss how to get MTM services started in a community setting.
- Describe the process for billing for MTM services.
- Identify resources available to enhance your MTM program.
- Document MTM recommendations and interventions.
- Identify resources available to enhance student learning in geriatrics, including those available through the American Society of Consultant Pharmacists.
- Discuss evaluation of student performance in geriatric APPEs.

Examples: mini-cog exam, Katz index of activities of daily living, geriatric depression scale, and others.

- Demonstrate the ability to provide MTM services in the practice setting.
- Using examples and feedback provided by mentors and other program participants, develop an APPE syllabus appropriate for the participants practice site
- Serve as a preceptor for at least one fourth year pharmacy student for an APPE focused on senior care and MTM in the participant's practice setting.
